# HOW IS FASTING DIFFERENT FROM DIETING?

They might sound the same, but they are quite different. The critical difference between fasting and dieting is **intention**. Both involve a limited intake of food, but they are utilized and implemented differently. Dieting is purely for the sake of physical health or even personal vanity, while fasting is a spiritual exercise.

What does this spiritual exercise do?

A few of the main benefits of fasting: it tames our bodily appetites, which can be sources of temptation for us; detaches us from physical comforts, which can weaken us and impede growth in virtue; and aids us in personal



self-mastery, so that we can resist sin and choose the good even when it's difficult to do so.

Fasting also purifies and liberates our prayer. The detachment it produces sharpens our focus on God and helps us to enter into prayer more freely. It quiets the demands of the body so that we can focus on God without hindrance.

In fact, fasting isn't just helpful to prayer: it must be joined to prayer. It's ineffective on its own.

#### As St. Peter Julian Eymard said:

"The two actions must be joined and never separated, filling our soul with love by prayer, and purifying ourselves exteriorly by mortification. It is easy to say, 'I love God,' but if this word is not followed by mortification, it is vain and unfounded. Self-love has quickly taken the place of the love of God."

Fasting has physical benefits, as well, as the secular world has recently discovered. It goes to show that God takes care of *all* our needs, physical and spiritual—body and soul!

This ancient spiritual practice isn't optional. Fasting combined with prayer is a crucial part of our progress towards God. The Church actually prescribes two obligatory fast days a year: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. In addition to these days, we should consider adding in a bit of extra fasting to our spiritual routines, according to our ability, health, and duties in life.

What better time to start a new routine than Lent, coming up in just a couple short weeks?

#### SAINT GABRIEL OF OUR LADY OF SORROWS

Saint of the Day: February 27

Patron Saint of Clergy, Young People and Sudents

Born in Italy into a large family and baptized Francis, Saint Gabriel lost his mother when he was only four years old. He was educated by the Jesuits and, having been cured twice of serious illnesses, came to believe that God was calling him to the religious life. Young Francis wished to join the Jesuits but was turned down, probably because of his age, not yet 17. Following the death of a sister to cholera, his resolve to enter religious life became even stronger and he was accepted by the Passionists. Upon entering the novitiate he was given the name Gabriel of Our Lady of Sorrows.

Ever popular and cheerful, Gabriel quickly was successful in his effort to be faithful in little things. His spirit of prayer, love for the poor, consideration of the feelings of others, exact observance of the Passionist Rule as well as his bodily penances – always subject to the will of his wise superiors – made a deep impression on everyone.

His superiors had great expectations of Gabriel as he prepared for the priesthood, but after only four years of religious life symptoms of tuberculosis appeared. Ever obedient, he patiently bore the painful effects of the disease and the restrictions it required, seeking no special notice. He died peacefully on February 27, 1862, at age 24, having been an example to both young and old.

Saint Gabriel of Our Lady of Sorrows was canonized in 1920.

When we think of achieving great holiness by doing little things with love and grace, Therese of Lisieux comes first to mind. Like her, Gabriel died painfully from tuberculosis. Together they urge us to tend to the small details of daily life, to be considerate of others' feelings every day. Our path to sanctity, like theirs, probably lies not in heroic doings but in performing small acts of kindness every day.

#### SERMON ON LUKE 6:27-38

veryone suffered during the four years of WWII. Not only our soldiers who were willing to die for our freedom, but also the people back home who made sacrifices to support our troops. My mother told me it was near impossible to buy shoes. She said, "My first date with your father was so embarrassing. I had to tape my shoes to keep them from falling apart. Your father then showed me his shoes. They had so many holes, he filled them with newspaper. We both laughed. After that I knew he was the right man for me." They married four months later and stayed married for 74 years. Every October 6th, Dad bought Mom new shoes on their wedding anniversary.

There is a story about a ten-year-old boy gazing through a shoe store window, shivering with cold. He was barefoot. A man approached the boy and said, "My little fellow, why are you looking so intently through that window?" "I was asking God to give me a pair of shoes," was the boy's reply.

The man took him by the hand and went into the store. He told the clerk, "Get this young man new shoes and ten pairs of socks."

The boy couldn't take his eyes off the shiny black shoes adorning his feet. He even wore black socks to match. The only black socks the boy ever wore were white tube socks that turned black from dirt. The man patted the boy on the head and said, "You look so spiffy!"

As the man turned to leave the boy grabbed his hand. The ten-year-old was astounded by the man's kindness. He looked at the man with grateful, puppy dog eyes and asked, "Are you God?"

Today Jesus is asking you, "Are you my disciple? If you agree to follow me, this is what you must do. What Jesus asks you to do is difficult. But if you do them, your reward will be great in Heaven. Here they are:

- 1) Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you.
- 2) If someone slaps you on one cheek, turn to them the other also. The word "slap" does not mean a physical slap. It means "insult." Do not retaliate an insult with another insult.
- 3) Give to everyone who asks you, and if anyone takes what belongs to you, do not demand it back. The "everyone" refers to people who are strangers you may not know. Sometimes, Jesus calls you to give to them knowing you will not be repaid. Jesus said to give to those who do good for you is easy. It isn't special. Even sinners do it. God doesn't give a big reward for that.
- 4) But love your enemies, do good to them, and lend to them without expecting to get anything back. Then your reward will be great. God says this is what makes you a true follower of Jesus. Jesus says this is what makes you a true child of God because that is what God does.
- 5) Be merciful as God is merciful to you.
- 6) Don't judge. You got your own sins to work on. Judge yourself, not others.
- 7) Do not condemn, and you will not be condemned. Forgive, and you will be forgiven. God says there is a direct connection between how you act to others and how He will act to you. "For with the measure you use, it will be measured back to you."

Jesus summarizes his "to do" list for the disciple in this one sentence: "Do to others as you would have them do to you." Jesus compels you to step beyond your world and look out for others. In your judgement God will treat you in the same way you treat others. The next time you go to a restaurant, you better tip your waitress well. God does not like stingy tippers. Blessings.
