From the Pastor's Desk



I recently had the privilege of spending some time in conversation with Archbishop Casey – a rare and welcomed opportunity. In our discussion, he returned to two themes he often emphasizes to us priests: first, that we are no longer living in the age of Christendom; and second, the importance of what he calls "the missionary moment." The Archbishop spoke about our time as a new apostolic age – an age in which the Church is called once more to live her apostolic mission: to go forth and proclaim the Good News to a world that, in many ways, no longer knows the Lord. His observation reminds us that society no longer views life through the lens of Christianity; hence, we

have returned to something very much like the early apostolic age. The call to embrace "the missionary moment" flows directly from this reality. Both as a parish community and as individuals, we encounter countless opportunities each day to bring the light of Christ into a situation or into someone else's life. As a pastor, I find myself asking: Am I, as a priest, making the missionary moment? Are we, as a parish, recognizing and responding to those divine opportunities to let others experience the light of Christ?

As we celebrate the Exaltation of The Holy Cross, Archbishop Casey's words echo even more strongly. At the time of the crucifixion, and throughout the early centuries of the Church, Jesus and His followers were often regarded as radicals who disrupted the peace and challenged the social order. Many gave their lives in martyrdom, yet the Church continued to grow—because of their courageous witness to the glory of the Risen Christ.

Today, we still lift high the Cross and proclaim Christ's victory over sin and death—a victory accomplished through the very instrument of suffering. We may not be worshiping in catacombs or fleeing persecution, but we do live in a world where the Cross, the name of Jesus, and the truth of the Gospel are foreign to many, and even offensive to some. The challenge before us is to step boldly into this new apostolic age: not overlooking the missionary moment, but embracing it and living as people who were made for such a time as this.

I invite you to join me in praying for our family of parishes—that we may become a true place of encounter with the Risen Christ for all who come among us. May our community be filled with missionary zeal and with the power of the Holy Spirit, bringing healing, hope, and grace to the world around us.

Notes From Fr. Adam Lewis

Brothers & Sisters, it often happens that I do not include all the material from my notes in Sunday's homily for the sake of brevity. I want to include some of last Sunday's notes here for your edification (23rd Sunday in OT):

The Cost of Discipleship vs. Cheap Grace:

Cheap grace is the preaching of forgiveness without requiring repentance, Baptism without Church discipline, Communion without Confession... Cheap grace is grace without discipleship, grace without the Cross, grace without Jesus Christ, living and incarnate.

Costly grace is the treasure hidden in the field; for the sake of it, a man will gladly go and sell all that he has. It is the pearl of great price to buy which the merchant will sell all his goods. It is the kingly rule of Christ, for whose sake a man will pluck out the eye which causes him to stumble, it is the call of Jesus Christ at which the disciple leaves his nets and follows Him.

Such grace is costly because it calls us to follow, and it is grace because it calls us to follow Jesus Christ. It is costly because it costs a man his life, and it is grace because it gives a man the only true life. It is costly because it condemns sin, and grace because it justifies the sinner. Above all, it is costly because it cost God the life of His Son: "ye were bought at a price," and what has cost God much cannot be cheap for us. Above all, it is grace because God did not reckon His Son too dear a price to pay for our life, but delivered Him up for us. (Dietrich Bonhoeffer, The Cost of Discipleship).

CCC 1618 Christ is the center of all Christian life. The bond with Him takes precedence over all other bonds, familial or social. From the very beginning of the Church, there have been men and women who have renounced the great good of marriage to follow the Lamb wherever He goes, to be intent on the things of the Lord, to seek to please Him, and to go out to meet the bridegroom who is coming. Christ Himself has invited certain persons to follow Him in this way of life, of which He remains the model:

"For there are eunuchs who have been so from birth, and there are eunuchs who have been made eunuchs by men, and there are eunuchs who have made themselves eunuchs for the sake of the kingdom of heaven. He who is able to receive this, let him receive it."









CONGRATULATIONS CHARLEE AND ANNIE RUSCH

WHAT REALLY HAPPENS AT A CANONIZATION?

Mother Teresa didn't see humility as the world sees it.

September 7th, the Church officially recognized two remarkable young men as

saints: Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati and Blessed Carlo Acutis.

We truly couldn't be more excited. Their canonization reminds us that holiness is not reserved for people who lived centuries ago; it is a calling for you and me. It also reminds us of the reality of heaven as we celebrate two more of our own reaching the eternal banquet.



But what actually happens at a canonization?


Canonization is the Church's formal declaration that someone is in heaven and worthy of veneration by Catholics everywhere. The day begins with a solemn Mass in St. Peter's Square, usually attended by thousands of pilgrims. After hymns and prayers, the Litany of Saints is sung, invoking the names of holy men and women throughout history.

Then comes the central moment. The Prefect of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints petitions the Holy Father three times to declare the candidates' saints. The Pope then proclaims: "We declare and define Blessed [Name] to be a saint..." With those words, the person is officially recognized as a saint of the Universal Church. Relics of the newly canonized are then honored and presented for veneration, a powerful reminder of their nearness to us in heaven.

Although this process is ancient, it is always relevant. Tomorrow we will see that in a real way as two young men, hardly different from any of us, will be declared and defined as saints.

Frassati, a lover of the outdoors who climbed mountains and served the poor, and Carlo, a millennial who used his computer skills to spread Eucharistic devotion, show us that sanctity fits right into ordinary life.

So let us go pursue sanctity. May we go forth with renewed hope that one day, we too may join St. Pier Giorgio and St. Carlo Acutis in heaven.
