From the Pastor's Desk



We have now been together for four months, and I wanted to take this opportunity to share an update on our Family of Parishes. It's hard to believe how quickly the time has passed, but these months have been filled with much growth and grace. Each October, every parish in the Archdiocese is required to submit a report of their Mass attendance for the month. I am very pleased with where we stand for our October count and with our overall attendance. Across our Family of Parishes, we have been recording attendance at all of our Masses and have seen steady growth, resulting in fuller churches, at or near capacity. I want to emphasize that all our parishes are doing very well. Each one has been consistent in attendance and has even experienced gradual growth, which is a wonderful sign. In Adams County, we welcomed Tim Palla as our new business manager for Holy Trinity and St. Mary, Queen of Heaven, as well as Ray Fox for maintenance at Holy Trinity. It has been a pleasure having both Tim and Ray join our team. I am also very excited to share that we have twelve adults in OCIA who will be received into the Church at the Easter Vigil. This is a tremendous gift for our Family of Parishes, and it is a privilege to accompany these men and women on their journey of faith. Please keep them in your prayers as they continue their preparation. For our students, PSR is well underway, and Confirmation preparation has begun in some parishes and will begin in January for the others. We will have a Confirmation Mass for our Family of Parishes in the fall of 2026. Once a date is confirmed, I will pass that information along to you. It has been wonderful to see a growing sense of fellowship and community among parishioners in each of our parishes. Our coffee and donuts gatherings, parish breakfasts, and carry-in luncheons have been joyful opportunities to get to know one another better. Congratulations to our Knights of Columbus in Adams County for celebrating their 10th Anniversary this month! This is a significant milestone, and I look forward to celebrating with them later this month with Mass and a chili cook-off. While there is much to celebrate, I do want to take a moment to address a few concerns that have been brought to my attention. As I mentioned earlier, all of our parishes have seen consistent attendance and steady growth. Each one is a vibrant, faith-filled community, and it is not my intention, now or in the future, to close any of our parishes. We have a strong and thriving Family of Parishes that continues to grow stronger. I have also been asked whether we will be combining our PSR and religious education programs into one. We are not combining them. Each parish will continue to offer its own PSR and religious education programs as they are now. Our evangelization team is working collaboratively to strengthen and build upon the excellent programs already in place, and I am confident that our opportunities for faith formation will continue to flourish. I am truly grateful to be part of Our Lady of the Hills, and I deeply appreciate your continued kindness and support. As we quickly approach the holiday season, I pray that each of you finds peace and consolation in knowing that our parishes remain places of healing, hope, and grace. You are in my prayers every day. If there is anything I can do for you, please do not hesitate to reach out. It has been a joy and an honor to serve and get to know you, and I look forward with hope and excitement to the graces the Lord has in store for us in the days ahead.

Notes from Father Adam



The teaching on the practice of prayer for the dead, is mentioned in Sacred Scripture: "Therefore [Judas Maccabeus] made atonement for the dead, that they might be delivered from their sin." From the beginning, the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice, so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God.

Note this and please note this well. This is very crucial. All Souls' Day is not just a day where we remember the dead. All Souls Day is the day where we offer prayers, and the sacrifice of the Mass above all, for the souls of the dead, so that they might be set free from sin and its consequences and enter into the glory of the Beatific Vision.

This is why it is so important to have a Catholic funeral and a Christian burial. So that when we passover into eternal life, the Sacrifice of Jesus in the Mass will be offered for us and our loved ones will have the opportunity to pray for us. Many of us will still have imperfections and the consequences of our sins remaining for reparation and transformation. Jesus has come to heal the whole man, soul and body; he is the metaphysician of our souls. So He will not permit us to enter into heaven still sick and disheveled. He gives us the grace of a final cleansing. And when we are purified and healed, we shall shine like the brightness of the firmament; and those who turn many to righteousness, like the stars for ever and ever.

CCC 1472 To understand this doctrine and practice of the Church, it is necessary to understand that sin has a double consequence. Grave sin deprives us of communion with God and therefore makes us incapable of eternal life, the privation of which is called the "eternal punishment" of sin. On the other hand, every sin, even venial, entails an unhealthy attachment to creatures, which must be purified either here on earth, or after death in the state called Purgatory. This purification frees one from what is called the "temporal punishment" of sin. These two punishments must not be conceived of as a kind of vengeance inflicted by God from without, but as following from the very nature of sin. A conversion which proceeds from a fervent charity can attain the complete purification of the sinner in such a way that no punishment would remain.

HOW DID THE SAINTS REST?

This season, with its shorter days and longer nights, provides a hidden holiness you may not expect: rest. Rest really can be holy. This is something the saints understood well. Rest is not idleness; it is participation in God's rhythm of creation.

From the beginning, rest has been sacred. "On the seventh day, God finished His work which He had done, and He rested" (Genesis 2:2). If the Creator Himself rested, then rest must be part of how we reflect His image.

But what does that look like in a world that never stops moving? Rest didn't mean inaction for the saints. Rather, it meant renewal. St. John Paul II, who spent his life in motion, carved out quiet afternoons for hiking and prayer. For him, physical rest was an invitation into contemplation, a deeply important aspect of the spiritual life. He once said, "Take time to look around you, to listen to the wind, to feel the earth. In those moments, you'll find God."



Even the busiest saints knew the need to step away. St. Teresa of Calcutta instructed her sisters to spend an hour in Eucharistic Adoration every day, no matter how many poor people needed them. "If we pray," she said, "we will have time for everything." And St. Francis de Sales, whose words still echo today, advised, "Half an hour's meditation each day is essential, except when you are busy. Then a full hour is needed."

Their example reminds us that rest should not be seen as a reward after holiness but as an essential part of holiness.

Rest may look different for each of us. But as the days become darker and shorter, spend some time considering what deeper rest God may be inviting you into. For some, it may mean making the most of the shorter day, not through increased productivity, but through a walk while the sun is still up, appreciating the beauty of the day, or through an evening Rosary prayed while the sun is setting.

For others, it may be an invitation to slow down and take on less. Prayerfully consider saying "no" to a few more afternoon and evening activities, making an intentional effort to get home as the evening darkness comes in, settling down into prayer or family time earlier than usual.

Together, as the Get Fed community, let us embrace this slower season. Because holiness is not found in endless striving; it is found in knowing when to be still and remember that He is God (Psalm 46:10).

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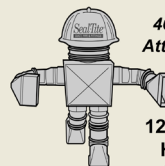
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
