From the Pastor's Desk



Like many other families, my family always had a nativity scene in our home at Christmas. These tiny figures commemorating the birth of Christ became an essential part of our Christmas tradition, and I must admit, as a child I did not think much about this scene outside of Christmas. After all, everyone knows that baby Jesus was born in December, in a beautiful stable, where he was wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger, right? Well, sort of. I am sure that most of us are familiar with the manger scene of my childhood, and perhaps most are like me and simply viewed it as a representation of the historical event, however this scene will set the stage for all that is to come. This storied scene of the first Christmas finds its beginning in the Gospel of Luke, where we read, "She gave birth to her first-born son and wrapped him in swaddling clothes and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the place where travelers lodged" (Lk. 2:7). However, this manger is not a child's crib, but a food trough for livestock. Jesus again associates himself with food in the Gospel of John when He gives us His teaching on the Eucharist. Jesus says, "I myself am the living bread come down from heaven. If anyone eats this bread he shall live forever; the bread I will give is my flesh for the life of the world" (cf. Jn. 6:25-69). We are quickly nearing the celebration of Christmas, when we commemorate the birth of our Lord, and proudly display our manger scenes in anticipation of the Christ-child. However, this is no ordinary manger, and He is no ordinary baby. The celebration of Christmas marks the arrival of the promised and long-awaited Messiah. Through the Incarnation, God becomes man and gives Himself up for us, "Take this and eat it, this is my body" (Mt. 26:26). The child once placed in a food trough gives Himself as the unblemished lamb, the sign of the new and eternal covenant. As we begin this Advent season, and make our preparations for Christmas, I invite you to spend some time in prayer with that tiny manger, for the child that you find there is for you a savior, and He continues to give Himself for you in the Eucharist.

Notes from Father Adam



Notes from Father Adam Lewis: The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe:

"In the first Encyclical Letter which We addressed at the beginning of Our Pontificate to the Bishops of the Universal Church, We referred to the chief causes of the difficulties under which mankind was laboring. And We remember saying that these manifold evils in the world were due to the fact that the majority of men had thrust Jesus Christ and his holy law out of their lives; that these had no place either in private affairs or in politics: and we said further, that as long as individuals and states refused to submit to the rule of our Savior, there would be no really hopeful prospect of a lasting peace among nations. Men must look for the peace of Christ in the Kingdom of Christ; and that We promised to do as far as lay in Our power. In the Kingdom of Christ, that is, it seemed to Us that peace could not

be more effectually restored nor fixed upon a firmer basis than through the restoration of the Empire of Our Lord.

If We ordain that the whole Catholic world shall revere Christ as King, We shall minister to the need of the present day, and at the same time provide an excellent remedy for the plague which now infects society.... The empire of Christ over all nations was rejected. The right which the Church has from Christ himself, to teach mankind, to make laws, to govern peoples in all that pertains to their eternal salvation, that right was denied. Then gradually the religion of Christ came to be likened to false religions and to be placed ignominiously on the same level with them. It was then put under the power of the state and tolerated more or less at the whim of princes and rulers.

Some men went even further and wished to set up in the place of God's religion a natural religion consisting in some instinctive affection of the heart. There were even some nations who thought they could dispense with God, and that their religion should consist in impiety and the neglect of God. The rebellion of individuals and states against the authority of Christ has produced deplorable consequences...

...the seeds of discord sown far and wide; those bitter enmities and rivalries between nations, which still hinder so much the cause of peace; that insatiable greed which is so often hidden under a pretense of public spirit and patriotism, and gives rise to so many private quarrels; a blind and immoderate selfishness, making men seek nothing but their own comfort and advantage, and measure everything by these; no peace in the home, because men have forgotten or neglect their duty; the unity and stability of the family undermined; society in a word, shaken to its foundations and on the way to ruin.

We firmly hope, however, that the feast of the Kingship of Christ, which in the future will be yearly observed, may hasten the return of society to our loving Savior."


