SOLEMNITY OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

We all have Catholic friends, family members, neighbors, or coworkers who have become disengaged from the practice of their faith. Many of them may just be waiting for a personal invitation back to regular attendance at Mass. WHY DOES ST. JEROME HAVE A SKULL IN HIS STUDY?

A book, a quill...It's easy to see why these are attributes of St. Jerome, the great Church Father, scholar, and Biblical translator. But...a skull?

The Feast day of St. Jerome (September 30th), one of the four great Doctors of the Western Church.

St. Jerome is easily recognizable in art: He is usually portrayed as an ascetic – sometimes in a cave or the wilderness – studying or meditating with books or scrolls about him, his hand grasping a quill as he writes.



He is shown in the wilderness because he spent a good part of his life as an ascetic in the desert. His books and other scholarly items commemorate his status as one of the great scholars of the Church. His writings include works on Scripture and theology, his famous translation of the Bible into Latin (the Vulgate), and his letters.

Now we come to the skull. Not something we would normally put on our desks.

In portrayals of St. Jerome and other saints, the skull symbolizes our mortality.

Memento mori – the memory of death – is something we as Christians should always have in our minds, though not for the sake of meaningless morbidity.

Instead, the recollection of death reminds us to stay detached from worldly things and to be always prepared to die, since we will die eventually, and sometimes unexpectedly. When our own death does come, may the Lord find us ready!

For Jerome and other ascetics, the skull is particularly suitable. They deliberately separated themselves from the world and embraced a life of prayer and penance in order to better attach themselves to spiritual things and to prepare themselves for the next world.

The skull could also indicate St. Jerome's spirit of penance for the sins of his youth. While studying in Rome as a young man, he fell into the immorality common among his confrères. Spurred by a guilty conscience and frequent visits to the Roman catacombs, he converted and was baptized in the 360s.

Memento mori, detachment, penance – a skull in your study seems a little more reasonable now, doesn't it? If you don't want an actual skull, we suggest another option: A book of prayers to prepare yourself for death.

BE NOT *Afráid*

When battered by life's storms, or immersed in a dense fog of suffering and uncertainty, we may feel alone and unequipped to handle the circumstances. Yet with words that echo through thousands of years into the corners of our hearts, the Lord says to us, "Do not fear: I am with you" (Isaiah 41:10).

He speaks these words not as one who merely observes our pain, but as one who experienced immense suffering. And the very wounds that bear witness to his suffering indicate the essence of our identity and worth: we are loved by God.

Reflecting on the healed wounds of the Risen Christ, we see that even our most difficult trials can be the place where God manifests his victory. He makes all things beautiful. He makes all things new.

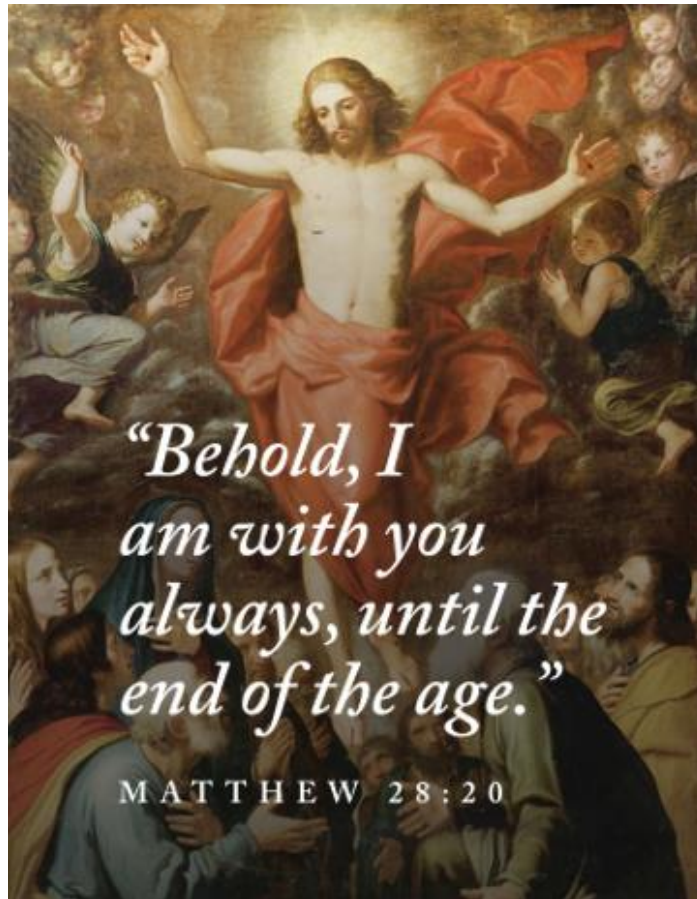
He is *always* with us. Jesus promised this when he gave the disciples the same mission he gives to each of us: Go.

Go be my hands and feet to a world enslaved by fear. Go to the woman who is unexpectedly pregnant and fears the future. Go to your friend who fears reprisal at work because he takes a stand for the protection of human life. Go to your aging parent in failing health who fears being a burden. And go to others, too, for their support.

We don't need to have everything figured out. We can simply follow the

guidance of Our Blessed Mother, the first disciple: "Do whatever he tells you" (John 2:5).

Walk with each other. Do not be afraid to embrace God's gift of life. Whatever storms or trials we face, we are not alone. He is with us.



RESPECT LIFE

SERMON ON HEBREW 4:14-16

The morning sun dispelled the dew on the grass, but not the suffering that would unfold that day. A family at Children's Hospital required my presence to give comfort at the passing of their baby. The parents' sorrow touched the doctors and nurses who worked so hard to give the baby a chance to live. This day would be different from other days at Children's Hospital. Before the sun set, four more children would pass; eight more parents would grieve. I was called to give comfort to them all.

My words and prayers would not take away the pain. The comfort I offered was hope. Our faith says death never has the last word. "Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?... But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ." (1 Corinthians 55,57)

At these sacred moments when a baby journeys to Heaven, parents will express fears. I give comfort by removing these fears. They don't need any more pain. One mother asked me, "How does my baby's soul know where to find Heaven? Will he get lost?" I replied, "His Guardian Angel will guide him to God's Throne. In God's Kingdom, a child's innocent soul is never lost."

A father expressed his fear, "I hope to get to Heaven. Will I see my son again? Will he know I'm his dad?" I replied, "In Heaven, your love for him will continue. Love never dies. You will see him. God who reveals everything will show your son that you are his daddy. You will be his father forever."

A mother's main concern was, "What will my baby look like? Will she grow up and I don't recognize her?" I replied, "In Heaven, you can see her any way you want. A mother's love always knows who her child is."

A father lamented he would never be able to celebrate Christmas with his daughter and buy her presents. I replied, "In Heaven every day is Christmas. God will give her all the presents her heart desires. Jesus already paid for them."

I was exhausted after five children went to Heaven that day. I always said Children's Hospital sent more holy souls to Heaven than anywhere else.

A big snowstorm arose on my ride home. Buckets of wet snow blanketed the hills.

When I got home, I sat on my bed looking out the window at the snowflakes falling all around. I felt so much sorrow I could hardly move. I asked God why He allowed this suffering. I prayed He would help those parents on their journey of tears. Then God gave me a powerful sign.

In the midst of this windy snowstorm, I caught sight of something that should not be there. One lonely, bright red cardinal was holding on to a tree branch to keep from blowing away. The bird kept staring at me. It stayed there for a long time, just staring at me.

I thought, "This must be a sign from God." I read about cardinals having a special meaning. In many cultures, cardinals are a sign of divine intervention. If a cardinal crosses your path, it is meant to give you strength and hope. Cardinals represent hope in the midst of tough times. In the Bible, birds were messengers from God. "If you see a cardinal right after the passing of a loved one, they are letting you know they made it home." (Jill Gleeson) There is an old saying, "When cardinals appear, angels are near."

God confirmed this sign a few days later. I was shopping at Goodwill for paintings. I came upon this one handmade painting that made me gasp. It was a picture of a cardinal sitting on a tree limb in a snowstorm. I feel peace every time I see it.

Hebrews 4:16 reads, "So let us confidently approach the throne of grace to receive mercy and to find grace for timely help." When life dumps on you, go confidently to Jesus for help. He will stand by your side with His shovel. I have a plaque that reads, "Jesus, there is nothing that happens today you and I can't handle." The Bible and a little birdie told me.
