WHAT ARE FOUR THEMES WE CAN FOCUS ON DURING THE FOUR SUNDAYS OF ADVENT?

Need a good way to really tap into this brief season?

Advent always seems to pass by in the blink of an eye, and this year—with Christmas Day occurring on a Wednesday—this season is almost at its shortest. Amidst the urgency of buying a tree, stocking the pantry, and selecting gifts, how can we intentionally slow down and focus on our spiritual preparation?

A good way to stay focused is to pick a theme for each week, meditating on it during your daily prayer (and even during activities like shoveling the sidewalk or peeling apples). Here are four possible themes:

- 1. Hope: The first week marks the beginning of the new liturgical year. The tale of our salvation has circled back to its starting point: the expectation of the Messiah. This week intensifies our hope in the coming of a Savior Who will free us from the chains of sin and become our Way and our Light.
- **2. Peace:** The Prince of Peace came among us at the only point in history when the whole world was at peace. Intentionally bringing stillness and peace into our souls through quiet prayer is the best groundwork for welcoming the Messiah into our homes at His Nativity.



- **3. Joy:** While Advent and Lent share the violet vestments, the sacrificial practices, and the spirit of penance, Advent looks forward to the incredible joy of our Savior's birth. We have been waiting for this moment for millennia, and now it is near at hand. What could bring us more happiness than the arrival of God's greatest gift to us?
- **4. Love:** Once the fourth week is here, only a few days remain until the Messiah is with us. Remember that God became Man because of His love for us. You can respond to this love by preparing a hospitable, loving place for Him in your soul.

This Advent, take a moment to bring these themes into your prayer. This set of four Advent Candles was designed to help you bring these themes into your home this Advent Season. With each candle representing the Advent theme for the four weeks, these candles will prepare your heart and home for Christmas!

THE ANGEL GIVING TREE - ST. BENIGNUS







1st CANDLE - (purple) THE PROPHECY CANDLE or CANDLE OF HOPE - We can have hope because God is faithful and will keep the promises made to us. Our hope comes from God. (Romans 15:12-13)



SERMON FOR ADVENT LUKE 21:25-36



psychology professor walked into his classroom holding a glass of water with his arm straightened out to the side.

He asked his students, "How heavy is this glass of water?"

The students started to shout out their guesses.

The professor replied, "The absolute weight of this glass isn't what matters while I'm holding it. Rather, it's the amount of time that I hold onto it."

"If I hold it for two minutes, it doesn't feel heavy. If I hold it for an hour, it will feel very heavy as my muscles begin to tire.

If I hold it for an entire day, that glass will feel so painfully heavy that all I will think about is the pain.

"In all of these cases, the actual weight of the glass will remain the same, but the glass of water will burden my life the longer I hold on to it."

"This glass of water represents your worries and anxieties. The longer you carry them, the more they will hurt you until you let them go."

Jesus says, "Beware that your hearts do not become drowsy from carousing and drunkenness and the anxieties of daily life." (Luke 21:34)

I think Jesus referring to drinking booze and jumping from one party to another has a deeper meaning. Jesus means avoid anything that burdens or dulls (makes drowsy) your relationship with God. Holding onto worry and anxiety is drunkenness to the soul. They dull God's Spirit in your soul and weaken your trust in God. The longer you hold onto them, the greater burden they become.

God warns there are three other things that damage your relationship with Him in 1 John 2:16. "For the world offers only a craving for physical pleasure, a craving for everything we see, and pride in our achievements and possessions. These are not from the Father but are from this world."

Many see Advent as a time to wait for the Christmas celebrations. The parties, the drinking, the food, the presents. This is the world's view of Advent which is opposite of what God wants you to do. Advent is not a waiting but a coming. Jesus is coming back. He said in Rev 22:12, "Look, I am coming soon! My reward is with me, and I will give to each person according to what they have done."

- So, what should you do to prepare for this coming which is so awesome the very "powers of heaven will be shaken"?
 - 1) Let go of the anxieties of daily life. Hold onto faith, not fear. A wise man once said when facing tribulations, "Hope for the best, prepare for the worst, and pray like mad." God says, "Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you." (1 Peter 5:7)
 - 2) Replace a craving for your own physical pleasure and everything that looks pleasing to you by doing what the Word of God recommends: "If you really fulfill the royal law according to the Scripture, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself," you are doing well." (James 2:8) God says, "And do not forget to do good and to share with others, for with such sacrifices God is pleased." (Hebrews 13:16)
 - 3) Live the five values Jesus taught: love, compassion, forgiveness, humility and integrity. These are not a set rules but a way of life. When the day comes when you meet Jesus (and that day will be here soon), He will judge you on how well you lived them.

Marjorie Holmes wrote, "At Christmas all roads lead home." Clear a road for Jesus this Advent to make His home in you. Blessings.
