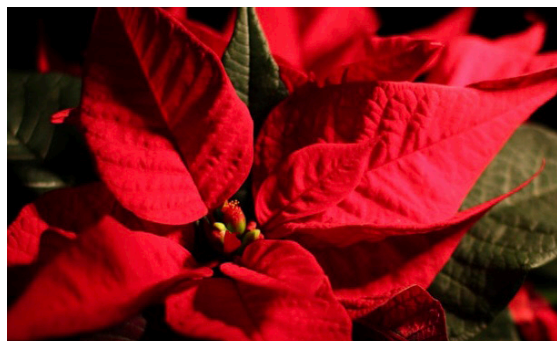

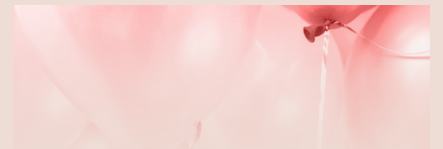

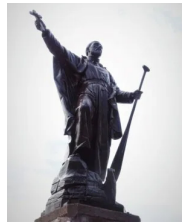

WHICH CHRISTMAS CAROL WAS WRITTEN BY A SAINT?



The beautiful Huron Carol uses American Indian imagery to tell the story of the Nativity. St. Jean de Brebeuf was a Jesuit missionary and martyr in the 17th century. He was sent to North America to minister to the Huron Indians around the time of St. Isaac Jogues. Brebeuf was able to penetrate hostile Iroquois territory in order to reach the Hurons. He gained respect for his giant stature and enormous strength, but the Hurons did not trust him and were quick to blame any disaster on his crucifix.

Fr. Brebeuf sought to reveal the timelessness and universality of Our Lord's birth, showing that the night of the Nativity happened for the sake of all mankind.

WHO WAS CALLED THE "SNOWSHOE PRIEST"?

Meet the astounding first bishop of the Mitten's icy Upper Peninsula. In the vast tracts of Upper Michigan, in thick-drifted midwinter, in wind or flake or stillness, the bent and burdened figure of a man could be seen trudging across the scudded snow.

He carried bundles on his back – medicines, linens, precious Viaticum – and tramped on worn snowshoes. He had no companions, no beast of burden, no means of communication, but angels watched his steps.

This is how Venerable Bishop Frederic Baraga administered to his vast diocese of Michigan for fifteen years.

He would travel as far as 250 miles on his snowshoes, just because he'd heard rumors of stranded settlers in need of Holy Communion or of a child at death's door. He always brought as many gifts as he could carry.

Bishop Baraga had originally come from Carniola, present-day Slovenia. He lost both parents by the time he was fifteen years old, but before their deaths, he had witnessed their strong example of virtue and piety.



At first, Baraga studied law, but upon graduation he entered the seminary. He was ordained just two years later, in 1823.

After seven years among his native parishes, he was sent to the United States as a missionary. His work among Germans and Indians bore great fruit. (Fun fact: Baraga wrote the first rules of grammar and a dictionary for the Chippewa language! He is holding his Chippewa dictionary in the image above.)

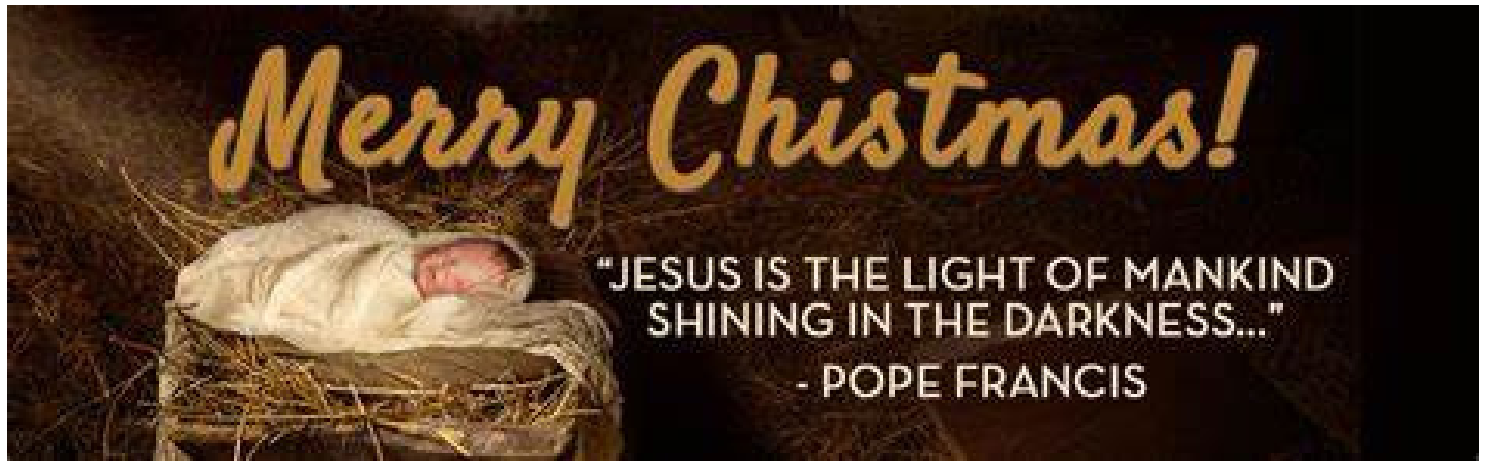
1853 saw him appointed the first bishop of Upper Michigan. Here he toiled among his loving flock until his death fifteen years later.

Bishop Baraga was joined in his missionary work by countless others. They established hundreds of Catholic churches and communities throughout the United States.

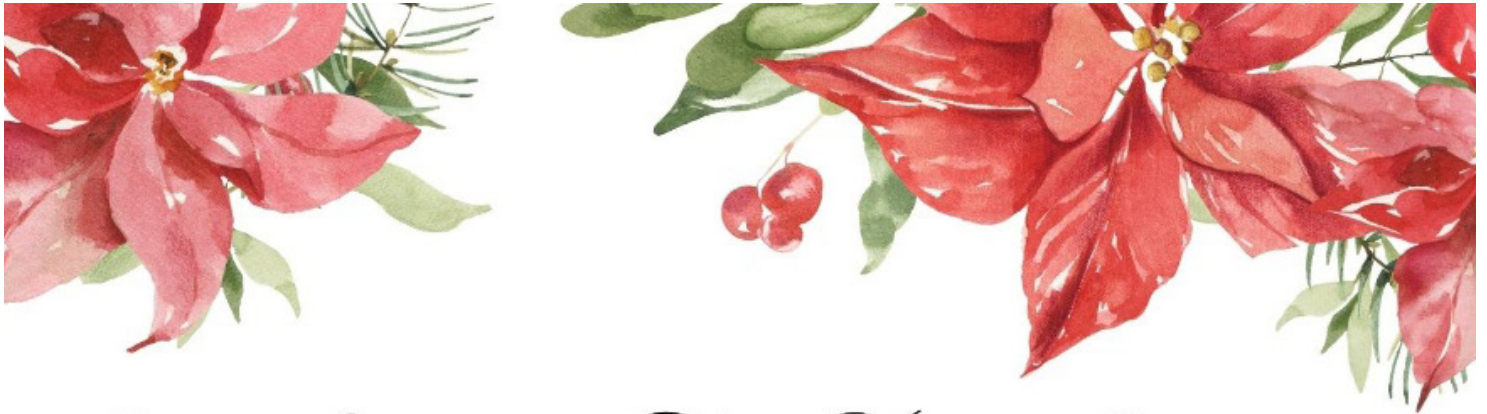

SERMON ON LUKE 1:39-45

With the meeting of Mary and Elizabeth, we see the two greatest women in God's plan to save His humans. They are great because God chose them to give birth to the two greatest men who would do God's will to save us: Jesus and John the Baptist.

But there is something else Mary and Elizabeth shared in common that you never hear talked about: shame. The towns folk would have viewed both these women with shame. They believed them to be unworthy of respect or honor. Why?

Others saw Elizabeth with shame because she did not give birth to a child for decades. Elizabeth endured a lifetime of being treated like a failure. The worth of a woman was based solely on her ability to be a mother. Society considered a childless woman as cursed by God. Mary fared even worse. The virgin conception of Jesus put Mary in grave danger. Here was the punishment for a woman who conceived with child by a man not intended to be her husband. "They shall bring the girl to the entrance of her father's house and there her townsmen shall stone her to death." (Deut. 22:20) Wow. Tell us how you really feel about that woman. And Jesus Himself would have been aborted. Thank God Joseph believed the angel. And thank God for choosing these two courageous women who did God's will despite the judgement of shame heaped upon them.

Through Elizabeth honoring Mary, we see God taking away the shame. Elizabeth said Mary is "blessed." The Greek word *makaria* spoken by Elizabeth is the same word used by Jesus in the Beatitudes. It translates in English as "Happy." Happy is Mary who believed. Happy is Mary who said "Yes" to God. Happy is Mary because God removed her shame.

The son she bore, Jesus, came into our world to remove our shame heaped upon us by Satan. God clearly said in Zephaniah 3:19: "I will save the lame and gather the outcast, and I will turn their shame into praise and renown in all the earth." God says through St. Paul, "Everyone who believes in him (Jesus) will not be put to shame." (Romans 10:11) God replaces our shame from Satan with His Love from Jesus.

I remember one night in the early 90's when I was on duty at the Care Unit Hospital. A father brought in his teenage son who was addicted to this new drug called "crystal meth." (It had just come to Cincinnati.) After a two-day search, the dad found him passed out, lying under an overpass in the city. He described what happened, "I picked him up and held him like I used to do when he was a baby. He looked at me dazed and said with a slur, 'Dad, why are you here? I'm not worth it'. I replied, 'You are to me'. 'But Dad I stink!' I said, 'I don't care'. My son then said, 'Dad, leave me alone! Please stop loving me!' I replied, 'I can't'." Dad paid for his son's treatment in full.

God gave us Jesus when we stunk from sin. He washed us clean by His Blood. He paid our debt to God in full. God could do this because an unmarried pregnant woman said, "Yes." Happy Advent.
