STUCK IN TRAFFIC? LATE TO WORK? TRY BILOCATION!

It worked for St. Vincent Ferrer!

Saint Vincent Ferrer was a man constantly on the move.

As a Dominican friar living in the 14th-century, he traveled across Europe on foot, preaching to little country towns and big cities alike.

All this walking could be tedious and tiresome, but St. Vincent didn't mind. He simply kept walking and kept preaching.

Well, he did have a little help...

Let us tell you a miraculous story:

Once Vincent had to preach in a city quite a distance away. He set out with a group, but somehow they fell behind schedule. This was the Middle Ages, so there were no high-speed trains or Google Maps to tell you when you'd arrive – or that you were late.

Realizing he wouldn't make it on time, Vincent reportedly turned to his companions and said something saintly like, "Let's just keep walking and trust in God."

But here's where it gets interesting: despite the journey being too long to finish in a day, the group arrived not only on time but early. The people in the town said they'd seen Vincent arrive, go to the church, and begin preaching well before he actually got there.

In other words, he was in two places at once.

Most of us would call it "impossible," but theologians call this miracle bilocation.

Vincent didn't stop moving just because he believed he would be late. He kept moving, trusted God to fill in the gap, and apparently, God did just that.

The rest of us probably won't bilocate anytime soon, but the lesson still holds. When we feel like we're falling behind – whether spiritually or just in life – it's often less about running faster and more about walking in the right direction, trusting that God will get us there.

Whether you're heading to daily Mass or just trying to survive the morning commute. Some Saints walked. You drive.

SAINT BERNADETTE SOUBIROUS

Saint of the Day: April 16

Patron Saint of bodily illness

Bernadette Soubirous was born in 1844, the first child of an extremely poor miller in the town of Lourdes in southern France. The family was living in the basement of a dilapidated building when on February 11, 1858, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to Bernadette in a cave above the banks of the Gave River near Lourdes. Bernadette, 14 years old, was known as a virtuous girl though a dull student who had not even made her first Holy Communion. In poor health, she had suffered from asthma from an early age. There were 18 appearances in all, the final one occurring on the feast of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel, July 16.

According to Bernadette, the Lady of her visions was a girl of 16 or 17 who wore a white robe with a blue sash. Yellow roses covered her feet, a large rosary was on her right arm. In the vision on March 25, she told Bernadette, "I am the Immaculate Conception." It was only when the words were explained to her that Bernadette came to realize who the Lady was.

Few visions have ever undergone the scrutiny that these appearances of the Immaculate Virgin were subject to. Lourdes became one of the most popular Marian shrines in the world, attracting millions of visitors. Miracles were reported at the shrine and in the waters of the spring. After thorough investigation, Church authorities confirmed the authenticity of the apparitions in 1862.

During her life, Bernadette suffered much. She was hounded by the public as well as by civic officials until at last she was protected in a convent of nuns. Five years later, she petitioned to enter the Sisters of Notre Dame of Nevers. After a period of illness she was able to make the journey from Lourdes and enter the novitiate. But within four months of her arrival she was given the last rites of the Church and allowed to profess her vows. She died on April 16, 1879, at the age of 35. Bernadette Soubirous was canonized in 1933.
