HOW MANY APPROVED MARIAN APPARITIONS ARE THERE?

And how does the Church decide?

It's amazing to consider that Our Lady, the Mother of God and Queen of Heaven, wants to visit us here on earth.

Throughout history, Our Lady has appeared to all sorts of people, from farmers and peasants to rulers and religious. However, not all of these claims are accepted by the Catholic Church.

The Church actually has a rigorous process for investigating and approving apparitions to ensure the messages align with Catholic teaching and there's no deception involved.

As of today, there are **16 Marian apparitions officially recognized** by the Vatican.

Here's the full list:

- 1. Our Lady of Guadalupe (Mexico, 1531)
- 2. Our Lady of Lezajsk (Poland, 1578)
- 3. Our Lady of Silvua (Lithuania, 1608–1612)
- 4. Our Lady of Laus (France, 1664–1718)
- 5. Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal (Paris, France, 1830)
- 6. Our Lady of Zion (Rome, 1842)
- 7. Our Lady of La Salette (France, 1846)
- 8. Our Lady of Lourdes (France, 1858)
- 9. Our Lady of Pontmain (France, 1871)
- 10. Our Lady of Gietrzwałd (Poland, 1877)
- 11. Our Lady of Knock (Ireland, 1879)
- 12. Our Lady Help of Christians (Czech Republic, 1885)
- 13. Our Lady of Fatima (Portugal, 1917)
- 14. Our Lady of the Golden Heart (Belgium, 1932)
- 15. Our Lady of Banneux (Belgium, 1933)
- **16. Our Lady of Kibeho** (Rwanda, 1981–1989)

So why only 16?

Well, the Church is very cautious in these matters. Each case is investigated with great care to avoid misleading the faithful. The process can take years, even centuries, and involves examining the messages, the fruits of the apparition (like conversions and miracles), and the character of those who reported the apparitions.

In short, the Church doesn't rush to judgment. It's more important to be thorough than to be quick, and the Church wants to ensure that any approved apparition truly leads people closer to Christ through Mary.



Also, this does not mean that the Church belittles or doubts other reports of Marian apparitions. She simply doesn't believe that public approval of that apparition is necessary or she hasn't fully investigated the extent and message of the apparition.

Many of Our Lady's apparitions to saints, such as St. Alphonsus Liguori, are not officially approved by the Catholic Church, but they can still be believed by Catholics.

There are actually several apparitions that have not been approved by the Vatican but have been approved by local bishops. Did you know that one of these locally-approved Marian apparitions actually took place in Wisconsin?

Yes! Our Lady of Good Help appeared in Champion, Wisconsin in 1859 to Adele Brise. In this apparition, Our Lady asked Adele to evangelize the pioneer families of that region and revealed herself as Our Lady, Queen of Heaven. These apparitions took place the year after the Marian apparitions at Lourdes!

Few of us will receive apparitions of Our Lady, but she still longs to be with us and guide us to her Son. This should be inspiring and comforting!

HABEMUS PAPAM POPE LEO XIV May 8, 2025

Pope Leo XIV was born September 14, 1955, in Chicago, Illinois. He holds a bachelor's degree from the Augustinian-run Villanova University in Pennsylvania and joined the order in 1977, making his solemn vows in 1981.

He joined the Augustinian mission in Peru in 1985 and largely worked in the country until 1999 when he was elected head of the Augustinians' Chicago-based province. From 2001 to 2013, he served as prior general of the worldwide order. In 2015, Pope Francis named him bishop of Chiclayo, in northern Peru, and the pope asked him also to be apostolic administrator of Callao, Peru, from April 2020 to May 2021.

Pope Francis elevated him to Cardinal in the Consistory of September 30, 2023, when he was assigned Cardinal of St. Monica. On February 6, 2025, Pope Francis promoted him to the highest degree of Cardinals, granting him the title of the Suburbicarian Church of Albano.

On May 8, 2025, Cardinal Protodeacon Dominique Mamberti pronounced the formula, "Habemus Papam," proclaiming to the city of Rome and to the whole world the news of the election of Robert Francis Cardinal Prevost as Pope Leo XIV.

SERMON ON JOHN 13: 31-35

esus gathered with His Apostles. The next day He would die. Jesus gave them His last teaching that summed up everything He taught them for three years. "So now I am giving you a new commandment: Love each other. Just as I have loved you, you should love each other." (John 13:34) Why did Jesus call this a "new commandment?" The Jewish religious leaders taught that we should love. But their teaching on love was incomplete. They taught one is only required to offer a type of love called "storge." Storge love exists between family members, friends, or companions. You love them because they love you back.

Jesus teaches a new type of love called "agape." It is the highest love because it demands you be willing to make sacrifices for the one you love. It is completely selfless. Jesus makes this love new because it is based on how God loves. Jesus is saying, if you want to be my disciple, you must love the way God loves you. Jesus gives a completely new teaching on love that no one had ever heard before. For the first and only time in history, Jesus will create a new church based solely upon agape love. "This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." (John 13:35)

Jesus based His Church on the way God loves you. I ask, "How does God love?" God's Love is not based on the worthiness of the one He loves. No one is worthy. Jesus washed the feet of Peter who denied knowing Him, the feet of Thomas who doubted Him and the feet of Judas who betrayed Him. Jesus still loves you even when you doubt, deny and betray Him. I left the seminary 50 years ago when I was told I had no vocation to priesthood. I also left the church for over a year. I doubted God loved me. I denied God the worship He deserved. I betrayed Him by turning my back on Him. Did God turn His back on me? No. He never gave up on me. He sent me a kind priest who brought me back to God. When I spiritually turned around, I beheld the face of Jesus in Fr. Ed, a small, fivefoot, four-inch Irish priest whose love made me whole again. He would say to me, "Michael me boy, God has a plan for you. Be patient and keep faith." Five years later, Fr. Ed put the stole around my shoulders on my ordination day. That was 44 years ago on June 13th.

The more you live a life of agape love, the more it will flow out of you to others. Then you will become a blessing to others. I remember my first day of ministry at St. Al's Orphanage. There lived teenage boys and girls whose families could not care for them or wanted them. I arrived on a day after a heavy snowfall. The kids wanted to play in the snow. I joined them. A big snowball fight ensued. Guess who was their favorite target? Me. Those kids could make a snowball really fast. When I would bend down to make a snowball, they would lob four snowballs right at my rear. One kid said, "an easy target."

When the fight ended, one young boy asked me, "Why are you here with us?" Before I could answer another boy gave a surprisingly insightful answer. He said, "God sent him here to say He loves us."

The Father sent Jesus to show us what true love looks like. It looks like Jesus kneeling at the feet of flawed and sinful men, washing their feet. Jesus commands us to do the same. I want to thank you for giving me the honor to wash your feet for twenty years. You are a blessing to me.
