WHICH SAINT'S SCARRED FACE BECAME RADIANT AT HER DEATH?

The Lily of the Mohawk grew tall amidst the flames of suffering. It was a challenge to write this article.

What can we say about this extraordinary saint that has not already been said? How do we go beyond just listing facts? How do we go deeper into her unique heroism, shrouded as it is in both the mists of time and the sheer legendary-ness of her story – taken, it seems, from the books of the most daring tales of early America? Danger, immense suffering and deprivation, fortitude, courage, heroism – the life of St. Kateri Tekakwitha has everything you want in an American story. This girl's capacity to *endure* is the stuff of legends, except that the legend is *true*.

Tekakwitha, daughter of a Mohawk chief, was born near the present location of Auriesville, New York. It was here that St. Isaac Jogues and his companions were martyred for the Faith not long before. The witness of her Christian Algonquin mother was most likely her first encounter with the Faith.

Her life was hard from the start. A smallpox epidemic took the lives of her parents and brother when she was a child, and left her own face scarred and her eyesight impaired.

She learned more about the Faith from Jesuit missionaries who had an uneasy presence in her village – the village leaders weren't thrilled about them being there, but had to accommodate them due to a treaty requirement with the French.

The young Tekakwitha was inspired to become a Christian. She was filled with a desire to dedicate her life to God, and refused a marriage that was arranged for her, much to the consternation of her tribe. She was baptized with the name Kateri — the Mohawk version of Catherine—around the age of eighteen. The difficulties with her family and village only continued, and she was subjected to persecution and scorn for her beliefs.



On the advice of a priest, she decided to leave for a place where she could live her faith in peace.

The destination: Kahnawake, a Native Catholic village near Montréal, Canada. It was 200 miles away.

Here, she at last was able to live freely among other Native Catholics. She made a vow of virginity and spent peaceful hours in prayer and works of charity. She had a stunning capacity for penance and took many sacrifices upon herself for the love of God. She only lived a few years in her new community before moving on to eternal life at the age of twenty-four. At her death, witnesses say her scarred face became clear and lovely, and shone with a supernatural radiance.

Perhaps her story is hard to write because it simply speaks for itself. St. Kateri, Lily of the Mohawk, pray for us!

From the Pastor's Desk



When I think of the Eucharist, and Eucharistic Adoration, I think of one word: Encounter. Each time we experience the Sacraments, most especially the Eucharist, we are given the opportunity to have a profound encounter with Jesus. Through Eucharistic Adoration we are invited to spend time in the presence of Jesus Christ, truly present. In this devotion, we open our hearts to the living presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament, allowing us to deepen our relationship with Him. In Adoration, we acknowledge that the Eucharist is not a symbol of Christ, but the actual Body and Blood of Jesus. This mystery, rooted in the words of Jesus at the Last Supper, and "This is my Body, which will be given up for you" invites us into a profound encounter with God. It is a moment of prayer, reverence, and silent communion, where we are called to listen and receive God and love and presence as He pours His grace into our hearts. Blessed Carlo Acutis beautifully expressed the significance of the Eucharist in his life. He said, "The Eucharist is my highway to heaven." Carlo, who spent much of his life in Adoration, understood that the Eucharist is not just a sacrament, but a vital source of strength and guidance on our journey toward eternal life. His deep love for the Eucharist led him to promote Eucharistic Adoration, encouraging others to experience the transformative power of being in the presence of Christ. I invite you to an encounter with Christ! In every tabernacle around the world, Jesus waits for us so that we may receive this profound gift. The Eucharist is our highway to heaven, because it is Jesus himself, the source and summit of our faith. In our family of parishes, the Eucharist is exposed for Adoration on Thursday morning at 9:00 a.m. at Holy Trinity Church, and Thursday evening at 6:00 p.m. at St. Mary Church, both of which also offer the opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation. I hope to see you at one of our times of Eucharistic Adoration so that we may encounter Christ together.

DISCIPLESHIP

Reflection on Luke 10:38-42

What is going on in today's Gospel? At first sight it might appear that Martha is a nag and Jesus, a none-too-polite housequest. From the three stories in which they appear together, however, we know that Jesus and Martha were great friends; hence, it is necessary to understand their interchange within the context of their warm, mutual affection. I think we can glean several messages from this story, but two jump out clearly.

For the Marthas among us - people who aren't happy unless they are doing something - the message is to slow down and make time to listen to God's Word for us. We need this on a regular basis. Unless we listen, we are in no position to learn (the word disciple means student), and all our busy-ness will have no relationship to the Kingdom of God.

For all of us, we must confront and not yield to our human tendency to set ourselves up as judges over our neighbor. We cannot presume to evaluate how our neighbor's behavior is reflecting or resisting God's call. We have no way of knowing what God is doing in the hearts of others. What looks like wasting time might be an intense session of discipleship.

SAINT JAMES

Saint of the Day: July 25 Patron Saint of Laborers

James was one of the favored three who had the privilege of witnessing the Transfiguration, the raising to life of the daughter of Jairus, and the agony in Gethsemani.

Two incidents in the Gospels describe the temperament of this man and his brother. Saint Matthew tells that their mother came – Mark says it was the brothers themselves – to ask that they have the seats of honor in the kingdom. "Jesus said in reply, 'You do not know what you are asking. Can you drink the cup that I am going to drink?' They said to him, 'We can'" (Matthew 20:22). Jesus then told them they would indeed drink the cup and share His baptism of pain and death, but that sitting at His right hand or left was not His to give – it "is for those for whom it has been prepared by my Father" (Matthew 20:23b). It remained to be seen how long it would take to realize the implications of their confident "We can!"

The other disciples became indignant at the ambition of James and John. Then Jesus taught them all the lesson of humble service: The purpose of authority is to serve. They are not to impose their will on others, or lord it over them. This is the position of Jesus Himself. He was the servant of all; the service imposed on Him was the supreme sacrifice of His own life.

James was apparently the first of the apostles to be martyred. "About that time King Herod laid hands upon some members of the church to harm them. He had James, the brother of John, killed by the sword, and when he saw that this was pleasing to the Jews he proceeded to arrest Peter also" (Acts 12:1-3a).

This James, sometimes called James the Greater, is not to be confused with James the Lesser or with the author of the Letter of James and the leader of the Jerusalem community.


