WHAT DO A LION, OX, EAGLE, AND ANGEL HAVE IN COMMON? THEY'RE ALL SYMBOLS OF THE GOSPEL WRITERS!

When you see the four Evangelists – Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John – depicted in art, one quick way to know who is who is to look at their symbols, which are frequently depicted with them.

You'll see a man (usually portrayed as an angel), a lion, an ox, or an eagle. Sometimes artists utilize the symbols as stand-ins for the actual saints, so you'd need to know your symbology to figure out who is represented.

Let's start by matching the right symbol with the right Evangelist:

Matthew: Man/Angel; Mark: Lion; Luke: Ox; John: Eagle

The great Church Father St. Jerome, who lived in the 4th and 5th centuries, gave us the pairings as we now know them. St. Gregory the Great corroborated his interpretation.

The symbols themselves come from the book of Ezekiel, who had a vision of God in the midst of these four creatures. The Church Fathers interpreted this as a foreshadowing of the four Gospels.



We meet the four creatures again in the 4th chapter of St. John's Apocalypse:

"...the first living creature like a lion, the second living creature like an ox, the third living creature with the face of a man, and the fourth living creature like a flying eagle..."

Matthew's symbol is a man because he begins his Gospel with Christ's human genealogy, focusing on Christ the Man.

Mark is represented by a lion because his Gospel starts off with a roar. Right away in the first chapter, we are confronted with the fiery words of St. John the Baptist, the "voice of one crying in the wilderness."

Luke is accompanied by an ox, an animal of sacrifice. This is because the first event he recounts is the apparition of the Angel Gabriel to Zechariah, the father of St. John the Baptist. Zechariah, a priest, is offering sacrifice to God in the temple when St. Gabriel appears to announce the impending birth of St. John.

An eagle is the companion of St. John, because in his Gospel, St. John "soars" above earthly events to contemplate the Divinity of Christ. His narrative begins with these sublime words: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God."

The Church and her saints have always had a deep friendship with God's creatures.

SAINT IGNATIUS OF LOYOLA

Saint of the Day: July 31; Patron Saint of Retreats

The founder of the Jesuits was on his way to military fame and fortune when a cannon ball shattered his leg. Ignatius whiled away the time reading about the life of Christ and lives of the saints. His conscience was deeply touched, and a long, painful turning to Christ began.

It was during this year of conversion that Ignatius began to write down material that later became his greatest work, the Spiritual Exercises. Ignatius spent the next 11 years in various European universities, studying with great difficulty, beginning almost as a child. Like many others, his orthodoxy was questioned; Ignatius was twice jailed for brief periods.

In 1534, at the age of 43, he and six others vowed to live in poverty and chastity and to go to the Holy Land. If this became impossible, they vowed to offer themselves to the apostolic service of the pope. The latter became the only choice. Four years later Ignatius made the association permanent. The new Society of Jesus was approved by Pope Paul III, and Ignatius was elected to serve as the first general. Ignatius remained in Rome, consolidating the new venture, but still finding time to found homes for orphans, catechumens, and penitents. He founded the Roman College, intended to be the model of all other colleges of the Society.

Ignatius was a true mystic. He centered his spiritual life on the essential foundations of Christianity – the Trinity, Christ, the Eucharist. His spirituality is expressed in the Jesuit motto, Ad majorem Dei gloriam – "for the greater glory of God." In his concept, obedience was to be the prominent virtue, to assure the effectiveness and mobility of his men. All activity was to be guided by a true love of the Church and unconditional obedience to the Holy Father, for which reason all professed members took a fourth vow to go wherever the pope should send them for the salvation of souls.

From the Pastor's Desk



During my first year of seminary, I went to my spiritual director and said, "Father, I need help with prayer. I go to Holy Hour every day, and I pray for an hour, but it's just not working." With a slight grin, he replied, "Scott, you need to learn to stop talking. You're talking way too much." That response, though humbling, led me on a path of deeper understanding and would lay the foundation for a transformation in my life of prayer. Like many, I had over-complicated prayer. It isn't always easy - but it is profoundly simple. In today's Gospel, we hear the disciples ask Jesus, "Lord, teach us to pray." Jesus responds by giving them – and us – the Our Father, the most perfect and beautiful prayer. We pray it so often, especially at Mass, that it can easily become routine. But have we truly paused to reflect on what we're saying? St. Thomas Aquinas called the Our Father the "most perfect of prayers." In it, we ask for God's name to be made holy, for daily bread, for forgiveness, and for protection. The final petition is particularly striking: "Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil," or as Luke records, "Do not subject us to the final test." Does God lead us into temptation? Of course not. As St. Thomas explains, we are tempted by the world, the flesh, and the devil – not by God. Yet, in asking for deliverance, we acknowledge our need for grace and protection in the trials we face. This life, as a pilgrimage, will include hardship. The question is how we endure those sufferings with trust in God, or relying on ourselves? When we pray the Our Father, we dare to call God "Father" because through the Spirit of Adoption – given to us in Baptism - we are truly His children. And as His children, we can come to Him with confidence, knowing He hears us and provides for our every need. May this prayer continue to form our hearts and draw us ever closer to the One who loves us perfectly.
