



IMAGINE YOURSELF IN A BATTLE.

There are dangers all around you. You're fighting, but the enemy is too powerful for you handle alone. At your call, numerous warriors come to your aid, powerfully defeating the enemy and restoring



peace. You've seen victory and lived. This is not a fictional story. You fight battles every day, maybe not physically, but spiritually. Caught in a fierce battle between good and evil, you face many unseen dangers from the enemy, the devil, resulting in temptation, trial, and suffering.



BIBLICAL PASSAGES WITH THEMES OF PROTECTION

(CON)

When Jesus was tempted by the devil in the desert (Lk 4:1-13), he responded to each of the three temptations by quoting Bible passages expressing trust and dependence on God (Dt 8:3; 6:16; and 6:13). St. Paul reminds us that the word of God is the "sword of the Spirit' (Eph 6:17). There is a power in the words of Scripture: for consolation, for strength, for clarity, for protection. Among the many passages of Scripture that might be cited, the Church has found the passages included in this chapter to be particularly helpful. First, Gospel passages are presented, then a selection of Psalms from the Old Testament, and finally passages from the New Testament.

WHAT IS THE MEANING OF THE TRANSFIGURATION?

Do you know the deep connection between this event and the Passion?


The great feast of the Transfiguration of Our Lord on Mount Tabor. In this glorious event, we see the veil of Christ's Humanity briefly lifted and His Divinity shine forth before the astounded eyes of His disciples.

This event was meant to strengthen the disciples in anticipation of the events of the Passion, which would test their faith as never before. We see an instant connection between the Transfiguration and the Passion when we observe that only Christ's closest disciples – Peter, James, and John – are witnesses. Not long after, on a different mount, the Mount of Olives, these three would become witnesses of Christ's Agony, at which time His divinity would be hidden in the darkness of the Passion.

Interestingly, the two events are also connected by apostolic sleepiness: in both instances Peter, James, and John are overtaken by sleep at the critical moment.

They manage to stay awake for the Transfiguration, but it seems that the devil was highly invested in none of them observing either Christ's glory or His suffering.

In his brilliant work *Jesus of Nazareth*, Pope Benedict XVI delves deeply into the integral



The lesson, says Pope Benedict, that Our Lord is teaching the disciples is that the glory of God is only reached through the Passion. The Cross is His chosen way to redeem us and bring us into His divine life; and we must be willing to walk with Him if we are to see His glory.

4. Extend a personal invitation


When the time feels right, invite them to take a next step in faith. For some that might be an invitation to come to Mass with you on Together Sunday,

From the Pastor's Desk



It is hard to believe that we are almost two months into our journey together. It has been a tremendous joy getting to know you and worship with you throughout these weeks. I wanted to take a moment to give you an update from these first few weeks. As some of you may have heard, my grandmother passed away July 22nd, which required me to be away from the parish during that time. I am appreciative of your prayers and support for my family and me.

Every three years the active priests of the archdiocese gather for a three-day convocation with the archbishop. This year, this convocation was held during the first week of August in Wheeling, WV. It was a nice reset and a

great opportunity for Fr. Adam and I to enjoy some fraternity with our brother priests and get to know Archbishop Casey. Though it was a wonderful three days, it is good to be home and back in the parish.

Here in our family of parishes, there has been a lot of information gathering and trying to take some inventory of where we are as a family of parishes. Throughout these initial weeks I have had individual meetings with our staff, seeking to get to know them, what they do, and their perspective on where we are, and what I can do as the pastor to ensure we move forward in the right direction. I have made it my practice to check in with our staff on a regular basis and have given access to my calendar. It is my hope that these measures help with accessibility to me, as well as providing a clear and transparent way for the staff to see how and where I am spending my time.

I requested a list of shut-ins, and others who may not be able to come to church. Fr. Adam and I have begun to visit these parishioners and have been making sick calls. Sign-ups are currently out for Altar servers, and we are already seeing a positive response to this invitation. We look forward to continuing to engage our parishioners in opportunities for service and ministry. We are grateful for your kindness and patience with us and look forward to continuing to get to know you all.

In the coming days, I am meeting with the presidents of our parish councils so we can work together to establish a sound and effective structure for leadership in our family of parishes.

I am a firm believer in dialogue and collaboration, which means our parish council, finance council, and leadership team will play a key role in helping me lead our family of parishes. Once these councils and teams have been established, and a plan in place, I will communicate that information to you. It is at that time that we will be able to evaluate and discuss schedules, and the many other things that have been brought to my attention. It is my hope that having an extensive presence of the laity participating in parish leadership will bring a level of comfort to you and will aid in making informed decisions that have a positive impact on our family of parishes.

I hope you find this brief update helpful. Please continue to pray for Fr. Adam and me, and for our family of parishes.

FROM THE SAFE ENVIRONMENT OFFICE — With summer activities in full swing, we would like to remind all parish/school employees and volunteers of the requirements of the Decree on Child Protection. All employees and volunteers are required to have completed The Archdiocese of Cincinnati SafeParish™: Protecting Children from Sexual Abuse — Arch. of Cincinnati Edition. In addition, employees are required to complete an online background check, manual fingerprinting, and B4 form once prior to beginning employment. Ohio Department of Education licensees may have additional requirements, and school offices or athletic departments should be consulted if there are any questions. Volunteers are required to complete an online background check prior to volunteering with youth. Employees and volunteers are required to stay current in completing SafeParish™ quarterly bulletins. With the school year beginning in August, please make sure you are up to date on completing the quarterly bulletins or you will not be able to work/volunteer with youth until your SafeParish™ account is approved. Please direct questions regarding bulletin completion to your parish/school safe environment coordinator. Thank you for all you are doing and please stay safe and healthy!
