





SUNNYSIDE-UP: THE CONNECTION BETWEEN EGGS, ST. CLARE, AND CLEAR SKIES

What do eggs have to do with sunny days?

There is a tradition in which a faithful soul hoping for good weather on, say, her wedding day, could make a trip to the nearest community of Poor Clares. She would present a gift of eggs, along with a petition to St. Clare for clear skies, and the sisters would send up their own prayers in exchange for the kind offering.

The exact origins of the egg tradition are uncertain and details can vary, but here's the background: St. Clare of Assisi was a young Italian noblewoman who left all her wealth to follow in the footsteps of her friend and mentor, St. Francis of Assisi. She founded the Second Order of the Franciscans, known as the Poor Clares, who followed the Franciscan way of poverty and penance. The connection to good weather might have to do with her name, which means "light" or "clear." This makes her a fitting saint to invoke if you are looking for clear skies or interior light!



The gift of eggs, specifically, has various possible origins. For one thing, eggs are a useful staple for a religious community that depends on donations to survive. Interestingly, the white of the egg is known as the *clara* in Spanish. So eggs would make sense as a gift to the daughters of Santa Clara.

One monastery in which this is a particularly popular tradition is the Real Monasterio de Sta. Clara de Manila in Quezon City, Philippines, which traces its history all the way back to 1621. Founded by Servant of God Mother Jerónima de la Asunción, a Poor Clare from Spain, the monastery survived all the way into the 20th century before suffering the heavy bombing of the Battle of Manila in World War II. The community later rebuilt the monastery in Quezon City. Today, you can see engaged couples and other weather-petitioners bringing the community gifts of eggs, wrapped in brightly-colored cellophane packaging, to ask for prayers to their holy patroness for a bright, clear day.



Notes From Fr. Adam Lewis



Brothers & Sisters, it often happens that I do not include all the material from my notes in Sunday's homily for the sake of brevity. I want to include some of last Sunday's notes here for your edification (20th Sunday in OT):

From the living Tradition:

Are we to believe that he has commanded discord within families?... He does not say that a father is to be rejected by his children, but that God is to be set before all... You are not forbidden to love your parents, but

you are forbidden to prefer them to God. Natural children are true blessings from the Lord, and no one must love the blessing that he has received more than God by whom the blessing, once received, is preserved.

Ambrose, Exposition on the Gospel of Luke 7.134-36; trans. T. Tomkinson [adapted]

For [John the Baptist] says, "I indeed baptize you with water unto repentance, but He that cometh after me," and the rest; "He shall baptize you with the Holy Ghost and with fire." And St. Cyril picks up and says: 9 But wherefore with fire? Because the descent of the Holy Ghost was in fiery tongues; concerning which the Lord says joyfully, "I am come to send fire on the earth; and what will I, if it be already kindled?"

The witnesses who have preceded us into the kingdom [cf. Heb 12:1], especially those whom the Church recognizes as saints, share in the living tradition of prayer by the example of their lives, the transmission of their writings, and their prayer today. They contemplate God, praise him and constantly care for those whom they have left on earth... Their intercession is their most exalted service to God's plan. We can and should ask them to intercede for us and for the whole world. (CCC 2683)

From the Pastor's Desk



If you have ever traveled along the narrow country roads that pass-through mountains, those winding paths with one-lane bridges and steep drop-offs, you know how such a journey can stir up prayers you didn't expect to pray! While those roads might lead to my grandmother's house, today's readings remind us of an even greater destination at the end of the narrow way: the Kingdom of Heaven.

In the Gospel, Jesus continues His journey toward Jerusalem. Along the way, He is asked who will enter the Kingdom. Earlier, He had described the Kingdom as a mustard seed or as yeast hidden in dough – small beginnings that grow into something far greater. So, the question is a good one: Who will inherit this Kingdom?

Both Isaiah and the Gospel give us the answer: the Lord will gather people from east and west, north and south. This is the great hope we have as followers of Jesus, invited by God to recline at His table. Yet, like any journey, reaching our destination requires knowing the way.

The Letter to the Hebrews tells us that God's discipline, though sometimes difficult, brings "the peaceful fruit of righteousness" to those who persevere. This discipline is the guidance of Holy Mother Church. Through her teaching, her prayer, and especially, the sacraments, she leads us along the narrow road that brings us to life. Jesus reminds us that the way to Heaven is not easy: "How narrow the gate and constricted the road that leads to life. And those who find it are few." But we are all invited to sainthood, to the wedding feast of the Lamb, to the joy of eternal communion with God. Walk the narrow path with trust, following the Church's guidance, so that one day we may proclaim His glory among the nations and share in the heavenly banquet.
