From the Pastor's Desk



Who are you? I would imagine that most of us would answer this question by stating our name. But is a name truly the essence of who we are, or does a name simply state something about us? Take a moment and think about the question on a deeper level. Who are you?

Ultimately this question centers upon our identity and the very core of our existence; our name, profession, ethnicity, or other identifiers tell us something about ourselves, but they leave us short of who we truly are. In the account of creation given in Genesis 1 we read, “God made every kind of wild animal, every kind of tame animal, and every kind of thing that crawls on the ground. God saw that it was good. Then God said: Let us make human beings in our image, after our likeness. [...] God created mankind in his image; in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them” (cf. Gen. 1:25-27). Notice the subtle change in vocabulary: God makes every kind of animal, but when he gets to mankind, He dialogues within himself then He creates us in His image. In chapter 3, we once again see a shift in vocabulary; God forms man and places him in the garden. In other words, we become the work of God in a very particular way and are given the priceless gift of being the only creation made in the divine image.

The question, “Who are you?”, harkens back to this very moment of creation. You are a child of God, created in His own image and given His own life breath (cf. Gen. 3:7). While all creation is created good and is given as a gift from God, we are the only creation to be given this privilege of having within us the image of God himself.

The month of October is dedicated as “Respect Life Month.” It is a time for us to remember and give thanks to God for the gift of life, and to call to mind the image of the creator that is found within every human being.

Who are you? You are a child of the most-high God, created in His own image and likeness, known and called by name before you were even born. My prayer for each of you is that you would be given the grace to see within yourself the face of God, who in His unfathomable love has created you and given you a share in His own divine life.

BRING GRACE TO YOUR MARY GARDEN WITH LARKSPUR!

Known for its tall spires of blue, pink, and white, Larkspur has long been a flower of devotion to Our Lady, representing her tears. Planting it is simple, and its upward-reaching blooms remind us to lift our hearts toward heaven.

Here's how to plant Larkspur step by step:

1. Choose the right spot – Larkspur loves full sun and well-drained soil.
2. Sow the seeds – Direct sow in early spring or fall. Plant about ¼ inch deep, covering lightly with soil.
3. Spacing matters – Start seeds about 4 inches apart, then thin seedlings to 10–12 inches once they sprout.
4. Water gently – Keep the soil moist but not soggy while seeds germinate.
5. Watch them grow – Soon you'll see tall spires reaching upward, a living prayer of beauty in your garden!

Planting flowers for Mary is a beautiful way to weave prayer into creation.



GET FED: FOUR SAINTS TO HELP YOU WITH HOLY HOSPITALITY.

Hosting season is upon us. These saints get it.

There is something very essential about hosting to Catholic spirituality.

Throughout the Gospel, we see Christ going into homes, sitting with all sorts of people, sharing meals, and spreading the Gospel. The early Church was influenced directly by Christ and continued to gather in homes to pray and break bread; that instinct to welcome others is part of our DNA.

But let's be honest: hosting isn't always effortless and it doesn't often feel holy. It can feel like a juggling act of grocery runs, vacuuming, and hoping the casserole actually cooks through. The stress is real, and sometimes it overshadows the joy.

Which is why it helps to look to the saints – men and women who lived hospitality in both big and small ways, and who show us that welcoming others doesn't have to be perfect to be holy.

Let's take a look:

St. Martha – For when you're feeling frustrated.

We all know Martha. She's the one in the Gospel who's scrambling to set the table while her sister Mary sits peacefully at Jesus' feet. She gets frustrated but who wouldn't? Hosting is work. But Martha also had the courage to proclaim her faith out loud: "Yes, Lord, I believe." When you're tempted to grumble about being the only one wiping down counters, ask St. Martha to help you host with humility.

St. Zita – For the tired homemaker.

Zita was a servant in Italy who did all the behind-the-scenes work without fanfare. She's the patron saint of domestic workers, which makes her a natural companion for anyone running the kitchen like a command center. She didn't complain, didn't demand thanks – she just did her work well, with kindness. Ask her for a little of that quiet steadiness when your guests are eating faster than you can refill the breadbasket.

St. Elizabeth of Hungary – For an increase of generosity.

Elizabeth had royal wealth, but what made her unforgettable was the way she used it. She fed the hungry, gave her best to the poor, and turned her castle into a place of refuge. Hosting can sometimes feel like performance – matching napkins, polished silver – but Elizabeth reminds us that all that is for naught if one isn't giving with real generosity of heart. If your food isn't fancy or your living room isn't picture-perfect, it doesn't matter if you're generous in your love.



St. Pier Giorgio Frassati – For the more casual host.

Not every host is a meticulous planner. Some are more like Pier Giorgio – who loved bringing people together, hiking, and sharing meals. Rather than formal dinner parties or events, St. Pier Giorgio would create spur-of-the-moment gatherings and intimate moments with those who happened to be around him. If you feel pressured to host like Martha Stewart, Pier Giorgio says: relax. Genuine friendship and the intention to share the beatitudes matters far more than a planned tablescape and a 4-course meal. As Catholics, we must remember that hosting isn't about perfection. It's about presence. These saints lived ordinary hospitality with extraordinary love.

Above all, we should look to Our Lady who was a homemaker to the King of Kings. In simple, humble, service, Our Lady sanctified the tedious and mundane housework that is unavoidable in all hosting pursuits.

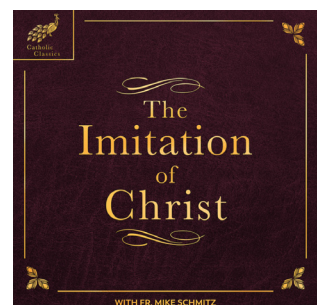

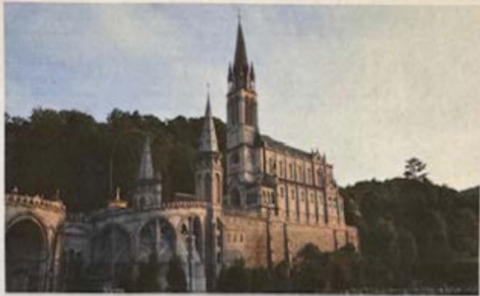
