From the Pastor's Desk



As we continue to celebrate the joy of Christmas, the Church invites us today to turn our gaze toward the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. In the quiet simplicity of their home in Nazareth, we encounter not an idealized or effortless family life, but a family that learned to trust God amid uncertainty, sacrifice, and love. The Feast of the Holy Family reminds us that holiness is most often lived out in ordinary places — around the table, in daily work, and in faithful love for one another. The first reading from the Book of Sirach speaks directly to family life, calling children to honor their parents and reminding us that such love and respect are pleasing to God. These words are not merely social advice; they reveal that family relationships are sacred.

Through patience, forgiveness, and mutual care, the family becomes a place where God's mercy is first learned and practiced. St. Paul, in his Letter to the Colossians, deepens this vision. He exhorts families to "put on heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience." These virtues are not abstract ideals but daily choices. Paul's words remind us that Christian family life is rooted in Christ Himself. When Christ is at the center of the home, love becomes more than emotion — it becomes a commitment shaped by sacrifice and grace. The Gospel from Matthew presents the Holy Family not in peaceful stillness, but on the move. Joseph is warned in a dream, and without hesitation he rises in the night, takes Mary and the child, and flees to Egypt. Here we see a family marked by obedience and trust. Joseph's quiet faith protects the Savior of the world, while Mary remains steadfast in her trust in God's plan. Even amid danger and displacement, the Holy Family remains united, anchored in God's will. On this feast, we are invited to reflect on our own families — whether by blood, marriage, or the bonds we form within the Church. No family is perfect, yet every family is called to holiness. May the Holy Family inspire us to place Christ at the center of our homes, to grow in patience and forgiveness, and to trust God even when the path ahead is unclear. Through their intercession, may our families become places of faith, love, and peace.

Notes from Fr. Adam Lewis



Fourth Sunday of Advent (Year A):

On the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary:

"Hail, Kecharitōmenē!"

Kecharitōmenē (κεχαριτωμένη) is the unique Greek word used by the Angel Gabriel to greet Mary in Luke 1:28, meaning "Hail, full of grace" or "highly favored one," signifying someone who has been permanently endowed with divine favor and grace, a completed action with lasting effects, supporting Catholic beliefs in Mary's sinlessness and unique role in salvation. NOTICE, the angel did not say, "Hail Mary" but rather, "Hail kecharitomene." Therefore the word is not simply an action but an identity. It's her new title/name. The perfect passive participle of the grammar shows Mary was acted upon by God (passive) and remains in that state (perfect tense) — she has been graced and continues to be graced. "Full of Grace": While it means "favored," the term implies a profound, continuous fullness, not just a temporary blessing, setting her apart from others. Divine Initiative: The passive voice highlights that this grace is a free gift from God, emphasizing her Immaculate Conception and sinlessness, as there was "no room for sin." Unique to Mary: It's a rare word, used only once for Mary in the New Testament, highlighting her unique status as the Mother of God.

St. Francis de Sales:

Do not limit your patience to this or that kind of injury and affliction. Extend it universally to all those God will send you or let happen to you... Complain as little as possible about the wrongs you suffer. Undoubtedly a person who complains commits a sin by doing so, since self-love always feels the injuries worse than they really are. Above all, do not complain to irascible or fault-finding persons. [Irascible means like irritable, angry people.] If there is just occasion for complaining to someone either to correct an offense or restore your peace of mind, do so to those who are even-tempered and really love God. Instead of calming your mind, the others will stir up worse difficulties and in place of pulling out the thorn that is hurting you, they will drive it deeper into your foot.

Pope BXVI:

"I believe that in our own day, after all the efforts of critical exegesis, we can share anew this sense of astonishment at the fact that a saying from the year 733 B.C., incomprehensible for so long, came true at the moment of the conception of Jesus Christ — that God did indeed give us a great sign intended for the whole world." Pope Benedict XVI, *Jesus of Nazareth: The Infancy Narratives* (New York: Image, 2012), 50–51.

CCC 142-143, on faith: By his Revelation, "the invisible God, from the fullness of his love, addresses men as his friends, and moves among them, in order to invite and receive them into his own company." The adequate response to this invitation is faith. By faith, man completely submits his intellect and his will to God. With his whole being man gives his assent to God the revealer. Sacred Scripture calls this human response to God, the author of revelation, "the obedience of faith." (Rom 1:5).







Dear St. Mary Parishioners,

As most are aware, there are a significant amount of deferred maintenance repairs that need to be made to our campus. We have gained estimates for repairs to begin in the St. Mary Rectory – for my soon-to-be permanent offices. We will also begin structural repairs on the main body of the church in the near future. Please note that in January your “Building Fund” envelopes will be called “St. Mary Maintenance Fund.” Due to the Hall being paid off, this Maintenance Fund will begin to help offset the costs and allow us to begin the repairs needed to keep St. Mary a shining pillar in our community. The estimated cost for repairs to the interior of the rectory are \$13,274.16. Please prayerfully consider how you can support the maintenance fund to preserve our beautiful church.
