From the Pastor's Desk



Tomorrow, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, a dogma that was solemnly declared by Pope Pius IX in 1854. This feast reminds us that Mary, from the first moment of her existence, by God's grace, was completely free of the stain of Original Sin, thus giving her the graces needed to become the dwelling of The Most High. Her freedom from sin, and her "Yes" to the announcement of The Angel Gabriel make way for the coming of The Messiah; she becomes the New Eve as all of creation is given new life through the gift of her Son. Coming from a Protestant Christian background, when I converted to Catholicism, I naturally had a lot of questions about Mary and our understanding of her. It wasn't until a few years after my conversion that I began to really develop a relationship with Our Lady. By this time, I had started seminary and would have described my relationship with Mary as being more of an acquaintance than that of a loving mother, so I set out to find Mary. And with the help of a fellow seminarian, I not only found her, but in her I discovered a most beautiful and loving mother. Writing of Mary, philosopher and theologian, Alice von Hildebrand said, "The dazzling radiance of this feminine place – the tabernacle of the God-man – must have blinded the angels, bringing them to their knees." In Mary, we have a most beautiful and loving mother, who never fails to bring us closer to Christ, her son. I invite you to welcome Mary on your own journey to Bethlehem this Advent and together, let us join all of creation in joyful anticipation of the coming of Christ.



SECOND ADVENT CANDLE/SUNDAY: PEACE

"May we be in this world a ray of that light which shone forth from Bethlehem, bringing joy and peace to the hearts of all men and women." – Pope Francis

The Second Candle on the Advent Wreath represents **Peace**. Like the first candle, it is also purple. Often called the "**Bethlehem Candle**," the Second Advent Candle reminds us of Mary and Joseph's journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem before Mary gave birth to Jesus. Notes from Father Adam Lewis First Sunday of Advent (Year A)



The precepts of the Church are set in the context of a moral life bound to and nourished by liturgical life. The obligatory character of these positive laws decreed by the pastoral authorities is meant to guarantee to the faithful the very **necessary minimum** in the spirit of prayer and moral effort, in the growth in love of God and neighbor.

The first precept ("You shall attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation and rest from servile labor") requires the faithful to sanctify the day commemorating the Resurrection of the Lord as well as the principal liturgical feasts honoring the mysteries of the Lord, the Blessed Virgin Mary, and the saints; in the first place, by participating in the Eucharistic celebration, in which the Christian community is gathered, and by resting from those works and activities which could impede such a sanctification of these days.

The second precept ("You shall confess your sins at least once a year") ensures preparation for the Eucharist by the reception of the Sacrament of Reconciliation, which continues Baptism's work of conversion and forgiveness.

The third precept ("You shall receive the Sacrament of the Eucharist at least during the Easter season") guarantees as a minimum the reception of the Lord's Body and Blood in connection with the Paschal feasts, the origin and center of the Christian liturgy.

The fourth precept ("You shall observe the days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church") ensures the times of asceticism and penance which prepare us for the liturgical feasts and help us acquire mastery over our instincts and freedom of heart.

The fifth precept ("You shall help to provide for the needs of the Church") means that the faithful are obliged to assist with the material needs of the Church, each according to his own ability.

On the "rapture"

The Catholic Church teaches that there is no distinct event known as "the rapture" in the sense of a secret, pretribulation removal of believers from the earth, as popularized in some Protestant traditions. Instead, passages often cited in support of the rapture – such as 1 Thessalonians 4:16-17 – are interpreted as describing the single, visible Second Coming of Christ (the Parousia), at which time the living and the dead will be united with Him in glory, followed by the general resurrection and judgment. This event is imminent, but its timing is unknown, emphasizing vigilance and faithfulness rather than speculative timelines.

Biblical Foundation and Interpretation

The key scriptural reference is St. Paul's description in 1 Thessalonians 4:16-17: "For the Lord himself will descend from heaven with a cry of command, with the archangel's call, and with the sound of the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first; then we who are alive, who are left, shall be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air; and so we shall always be with the Lord." The Church understands this "catching up" (from the Latin **rapiemur**, meaning "we shall be raptured" or seized) not as a separate evacuation of the just before a period of tribulation, but as part of Christ's glorious return at the end of time. The living faithful will be transformed and meet the resurrected dead to accompany Christ in triumph, in a public and cosmic event.

The Biblical Commission, in its 1915 responses on the Parousia in St. Paul's epistles, affirmed the inerrancy of apostolic teaching on this matter. It rejected interpretations that would allow The Apostles to express erroneous personal expectations about the timing of Christ's return, insisting that their words under divine inspiration convey truth without deception. Specifically regarding 1 Thessalonians 4:15-17, the Commission upheld the traditional patristic interpretation (e.g., from St. John Chrysostom) that Paul did not imply an exclusively imminent Parousia in which only survivors (excluding the deceased) would meet Christ. Rather, the passage includes both the living and the dead in the resurrection and gathering at the final advent, without suggesting Paul or his readers would necessarily be among the living witnesses. This aligns with the broader eschatological framework in Scripture, where Christ's return is a singular, unexpected event that concludes history, destroys the current heavens and earth, and ushers in the new creation. (cf. 2 Peter 3:10-13; Revelation 21:1) The Church cautions against overly literal or sensational readings that separate this "meeting" from the immediate resurrection and judgment, as such views can lead to errors like millenarianism.

Church Doctrine on the End Times

The Catechism of the Catholic Church emphasizes the imminence of Christ's return since the Ascension: "This eschatological coming could be accomplished at any moment, even if both it and the final trial that will precede it are 'delayed.'" Believers are called to live in readiness, as "the end will come unexpectedly and take the living by surprise," but no one knows the day or hour. (Acts 1:7; Matthew 24:44). There is no teaching of a preliminary rapture to spare the Church from tribulation; instead, the Church will endure a final trial before the Parousia, purifying the faithful through suffering.

Official documents reject related speculative ideas. The 1944 Decree of the Holy Office on millenarianism (chiliasm) states that "mitigated millenarianism," which posits Christ returning visibly to rule the world before The Final Judgment (often tied to rapture-like scenarios), "cannot be taught safely." This underscores the Church's commitment to a unified eschatology: one general resurrection for all (just and wicked), one Parousia, and one judgment. Early creeds, such as the Exposition of Faith against the Priscillianists (c. 5th century), affirm Christ's return "to judge the living and the dead," with the resurrection of all bodies in their earthly identity, reigning eternally with the saints in the renewed creation.

Distinctions from Other Traditions

While the term "rapture" appears in some Latin Vulgate translations of eschatological texts, the Church does not endorse dispensationalist views (e.g., a seven-year tribulation with believers raptured beforehand). Such ideas emerged in the 19th century and are seen as inconsistent with the integrated Catholic understanding of salvation history. The focus is on hope in the Parousia as the fulfillment of Christ's kingdom, not escape from earthly trials. Theologians like St. Thomas Aquinas, discussing Paul's personal "rapture" in 2 Corinthians 12:2-4, clarify it as a mystical experience distinct from the eschatological gathering, known to be real but not fully comprehensible in bodily terms.

In summary, Catholic teaching integrates the "rapture" concept into the triumphant Second Coming, calling the faithful to persevere amid trials in anticipation of eternal union with Christ. For deeper study, consult the Catechism (paragraphs 668-682) or the Scriptures themselves.


